This course is a language development course with a focus on developing all skills evenly, but focusing very much on gaining a deeper knowledge of grammar and improving speaking skills, which prepares the students for their future profession. Vocabulary development, everyday expressions, idioms, and the context in which they are used, are also an integral part of the course as well as listening and reading comprehension and writing. Students enter the course at level B1+ of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages and end the course at Level B2-. For more information on what these levels mean see 'Common European Framework of Reference for languages'.

Week 11. Skills development: the vocabulary of books and films, phrasal verbs type 1

Week 12. Skills development: listening comprehension, showing interest and surprise, diphthongs

Individual work

After finishing each unit of the coursebook students are required to choose a language skill (reading, writing, speaking, listening, or mediation) and devise one task which helps to practice or revise one of the language issues of the unit. During the last lesson (12th May) students have to present their tasks in class.

Evaluation and marks

This term ends with a mark. The mark is based on the end-of-term test (75%) and individual work (25%). Students will get a signature for the term if they sit for the test and do not miss more than 30% of the lessons.
