OKTATÁS CÉLJA / AIM OF THE COURSE

Aim of the course

Introduction to English Language and Culture aims to develop students' foreign language competences through exploring the target language culture and make students familiar with the genres of a magazine which promotes their writing skills. The course puts the main focus on developing speaking and writing skills, which are implemented through exchanging information, discussion, debate and project work while collaborating in pairs or small groups in order to produce their own magazine. Furthermore, the students' presentation skills are also developed. Concerning writing skills development students' analytical thinking is facilitated while learning useful writing strategies.

COURSE REQUIREMENT

The term ends in a mark. The mark is based on 2 tasks:

1. developing and introducing a magazine in pairs

- with **6 compulsory genres**: editorial + table of contents, interview/report, descriptive article, book/film review, informative/service article, short news;
- with **4 chosen genres** from the following ones: cartoon strips, crossword puzzles or word search, quizzes, horoscopes, jokes, poems, Agony Aunt problem-solving page, programme offer, any kinds of "round-up magazine articles": quotations, opinions, statistics, anecdotes, recipes.
- **2. making a 15-20 minute presentation** on a well-focussed topic on English-speaking culture, nation or language.

ASSESSMENT

Magazine: 50% of the final mark

- every week, different type of written homework is given, which are marked individually. These written assignments can later be part of your magazine with some modifications.

Oral presentation: 50% of the final mark
