## OKTATÁS CÉLJA / AIM OF THE COURSE

This course is designed to provide a fundamental introduction to leadership, focusing on the qualities of effective leaders. Emphasis is placed on the practical application of leadership skills. The course will cover various topics, including: Understanding the concept of leadership; Recognizing key leadership traits; Engaging individuals' strengths; Exploring different leadership styles; Developing essential leadership skills; Creating a compelling vision; Establishing a positive team climate; Managing conflict; Addressing ethical considerations in leadership; Overcoming obstacles.

Students will evaluate their own leadership traits and skills to enhance their leadership performance.

The aim of the course is to enable students to collaborate effectively as a team while tackling practical tasks. Specific goals include:

- Successfully applying the project management toolkit
- Communicating effectively within and outside the team
- Gaining experience in collecting and analyzing reliable information sources
- Reaching solutions through constructive debate on the issues presented
- Documenting the problem-solving process in a clear and professional manner
- Developing the ability to defend and advocate for their ideas

## TANTÁRGY TARTALMA / DESCRIPTION

- 1. week: Introduction. Expectations. Description of project assignments. Leadership evaluation.
- 2. **week:** Leadership Development. What are the features of a good leader? Examples of good leadership styles.
- 3. **week:** Basic personal attributes. Personal integrity and reliability. Leading from within: The importance of knowing who you are.
- 4. week: Body language, speech, international cultural characteristics, etiquette.
- 5. **week:** Communication and writing: prepaing an executive summary in written and developing presentation skills.
- 6. week: Presentation: analysis leader roles (case studies or movies)
- 7. week: Consultation. Negotiation. Conflict and crisis
- 8. week: Presentation: based on leadership article.
- 9. week: Diversity and inclusion, importance of psychological safety in a workplace
- 10. week: Final presentations about the development of the leadership skills.
- 11. week: Final presentations about the development of the leadership skills.
- 12. week: Closing and evaluation of the course

The evaluation of activity during the semester and class participation will be based on participation levels. Successful completion of individual and group activities throughout the semester is required.

- 1. Presentation: Summarize a journal article and/or a leadership case study related to one of the course topics selected from the provided sources. You will deliver a 10-minute presentation summarizing the article and expressing your own opinion.
- 2. Group Work: Analyze a case study or movie that demonstrates different leadership styles.
- 3. Final Presentation: Prepare a presentation based on your personal leadership evaluation.

The requirements for obtaining a signature and the evaluation of the semester work are based on the submission of documents and holding the presentation as scheduled.
