### OKTATÁS CÉLJA / AIM OF THE COURSE

During the course students get to know the theory and practice of strategic planning (spatial planning) in the public sector. They will be familiar with the current planning regulations and the types and characteristics of national and regional plans. They will get pragmatic knowledge of the mechanism and methods of community based planning mechanism and the requirements of territorial plans. After completing the course, they will be able to navigate the spatial planning systems of the EU and the various planning styles.

- 1. Theoretical, historical and philosophical questions in relation to regional planning.
- 2. Theoretical foundations of community planning and planning styles.
- 3. Strategic planning in the public sector.
- 4. Territorial planning and programming in the European Union.
- 5. EU guidelines defining regional planning after 2014.
- 7. The history and practice of spatial planning in Hungary.
- 8. Territorial units with planning authority and the effective system and institutional system of planning.

- 9. The National Development and Territorial Development Concept, as well as the types of county plans and their practical knowledge.
- 10. Basics of regional strategic planning. The design process and the start of the design.
- 11. Data collection methods and situation analysis.
- 12. Defining the vision and target system of the regional strategy. Developing the regional strategy and operational programs.
- 13. The partnership negotiation process and the public. Evaluation of regional strategies.
- 14. Management of the implementation of regional strategies, preparation of action plans and calls for tenders.

## SZÁMONKÉRÉSI ÉS ÉRTÉKELÉSI RENDSZERE / ASSESMENT'S METHOD

Assessment and exam requirements

The exam and students' assignment consists of two parts. First, students work independently to prepare a written paper on the methodology and system of community planning by processing the current literature and a practical example (analysis of a specific regional level planning document). Secondly they will create a development strategy based on their choosen spatial unit, during the semester that will be presented in the form of a PowerPoint presentation. Both assignments have to be uploaded electronically to moodle. The presentation will take place in person in the last class. Students coordinate the selection of their own task to be analysed with the instructor responsible for the course.
