The aim of the course is to give participants a general perspective of the business law of the European Union. The program intends to equip participants with the ability to understand the real function of these legal instruments and with explication of the practical aspects, the course will offer a perspective to look behind the text of the law. The starting point of the course is an approach which emphasises a fusion between theoretical and pragmatic experience. The lectures cover not only the core elements of the internal market, but also related fields which help to understand the functioning of the economic integration within the framework of the EU. On completion of the course, the participants will have obtained a stable knowledge of the terminology of the EU Law; a pragmatic understanding of the legal frame-work underlying the EU's internal market and a basic ability to read and understand the case law method of European Court of Justice.
